4	Major incident Response Team (MIRT)	Action
	Paddy Chapman, MIRT manager, explained the background of the volunteer team and why it was set up in 1991. Members bring a range of professional skills and will work across the county and the city of York to support frontline response staff or members of the public after an incident has taken place. She explained the need to recruit new members to the team and that training was due to take place in September. It was agreed that she would approach individual organisations with a view to attending senior management teams to explore the mutual benefits of releasing staff volunteers to this valuable resource. 5	Strategic rail issues for North Yorkshire	Action
	Graham North, NYCC Rail Policy Officer, explained the current issues for rail in the county with a view to working together to take advantage of opportunities and developing a co-ordinated approach to raising concerns. One current issue is decentralisation about which a consultation is currently running. Dependant upon the outcome, there may be more opportunity to influence regional issues locally.	
	High speed rail is another area where developments are taking place and there are early discussions about how to open North Yorkshire up to the high speed route.	
	Graham explained the importance of including strategic rail issues in local development frameworks and it was agreed that he will approach district and borough councils and national park authorities with a view to working together on this issue.	GN
6a	Community plan updates – Providing older and vulnerable people with a range of choice for their accommodation, care and support needs	Action
	Juliette Daniel, Head of Extra Care for North Yorkshire County Council and Colin Dales, Chief Officers Housing Group, presented a paper suggesting key indicators to monitor progress in this area.	
	Juliette is currently identifying sites for 30 further extra care developments and will be working with a private sector partner to deliver mixed tenure solutions. She would be very interested to speak further to members of the group about the potential for sites in their areas.	AII
6b	Community plan updates – Delivering a high quality broadband service	Action
	Gary Fielding and John Moore, North Yorkshire County Council, provided an update about current progress including the procurement exercise.	

They highlighted a number of issues which they felt that the group could help with:

- Encouraging the progression of community projects, particularly in Hambleton, Richmondshire, Scarborough and Selby
- Communication of Go ON North Yorkshire, the campaign to encourage increased use of the internet. This is modular and can be adapted to suit any geographic location.
- The need to manage expectations and to take collective responsibility when delivering messages that communities might find unpalatable
- Suggestions for increasing the circulation of the Connecting North Yorkshire newsletter

It was agreed that increasing internet use and coverage would enable more innovative service from partners and the support of the Connecting North Yorkshire project was appreciated. Suggestions in relation to communications included town and parish council liaison meetings, area committees and district councillors.

6c Community plan updates – Communities where multiple deprivation Action exists

Neil Irving presented a paper proposing that partners work together to develop pilots to tackle multiple deprivation in identified communities in the county as set out in the North Yorkshire Community plan. The intention is to use work already being carried out across the county to inform these pilots. No additional resources are available to support these pilots, the aim being to target current resources more effectively in partnership and to ensure that this is monitored through the group.

After discussion it was agreed that the two geographical communities identified in the paper, Selby North and Skipton South, be the focus for pilots and that in addition parts of Scarborough borough be included in the pilot. Neil Irving to discuss with Jim Dillon what the areas to be included would be. It was also identified that health issues needed to be linked into work being carried out in the Harrogate district. Mental health issues were particularly highlighted and this was suggested as a topic for a future meeting of this group.

It was agreed that Neil would contact the relevant Chief Executives with a view to establishing task and finish groups to develop initial project plans for consideration at the September 2012 meeting of the group, with an interim report at the May 2012 meeting. Initial work will include looking at data, such as the Joint Strategic Needs Assessment and the Joint Strategic Intelligence Assessment, in order to inform the pilots. Those working on current projects across the county will be kept informed of progress.
