

Current Wellbeing and Prevention contracts- January 2018

The following information provides a summary of the services and support currently funded by NYCC Health and Adult Services Wellbeing and Prevention contracts. This information is based on information received as part of contract reviews. Please note some services are delivered using additional funds from other sources as well as NYCC funds.

Provider	Description of services funded
Bentham Community Café	Funding towards the Community Link Café based in Bentham, which provides activities and refreshments for local residents twice a week.
Boroughbridge and District Community Care	Funding towards provision of a range of services to older people in Boroughbridge town and the surrounding areas.
Harrogate and Ripon CVS	Receive funding for projects that provide practical support to help people in Harrogate and Ripon to stay independent in their own homes and address social isolation.
Pioneer Projects	Funding for monthly arts activity groups in Skipton and Settle for people with dementia, which gives carers respite to be able to attend the carer's groups which are run at the same time.
The Rainbow Centre (Also known as St Mary's Social Action Centre)	Funds a weekly activities and lunch club for people aged 55 and over in Scarborough.
REACT (Reaching Everybody Age Concerns Together Ltd.)	Funds the County-wide Prevention Services for Older People service. Service delivery is divided into three elements: provision of information and advice, day activities and befriending (mostly telephone-based with some face-to-face provision).
Ripon Vision Support Group	Funding for a weekly coffee morning with activities in Ripon for people who are visually impaired.
Sherburn Visiting Scheme	Funds a range of support provided to older people in Sherburn and the surrounding areas.
Sight Support Ryedale	Funding contributes towards organisation's room hire and transport costs for people attending activities.
Supporting Older People	Funding supports services provided to older people in Harrogate and the surrounding villages.
Thirsk Community Care Association (contract holder- but deliver contract as a part of a partnership with other local Community Care Associations)	Funds a befriending scheme delivered across the Hambleton district.
